

PARISHES AND MISSIONS

ACTON—St. Joseph's Church.

Built inside the village in 1858.
Attended from Guelph like Georgetown and Onstic till 1893.
In 1886 the present church was bought.

Resident Pastors:—Haley, Patrick, July, 1893, to March, 1898; Feeney, John J., 1898 to June 1908; Arnold, John J., 1908 to June 1909; Walsh, E. R., July 1909 to July 1910; Arnold, Jno. J., 1910 to Dec. 1910; Traynor, J. J., Jan., 1911, to June, 1915; Doyle, P. D., Aug., 1915.

Georgetown and Onstic are attended from Acton.

Georgetown—Holy Cross Church

Began about 1858. In 1886 a stone church was erected.

Onstic—St. Peter's Church.

Began 1850. In 1883 a stone church was built $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the old site.

ARTHUR.

Church site, 3 acres, Oct. 26, 1846.
Church dedicated Sept. 14, 1858.
It was riddled with bullets by Orangemen when filled with people on the 12th July, but no one was hurt.

Blettner begins Register March 8, 1857.

Laussie builds present church, 1875.
Subscription for cemetery taken 1874.
Sisters came into the school, 1873.

New school built and used Jan., 1885.
New Convent occupied about 1887.
New Rectory built, 1895.

Hot water in Rectory and Convent, 1911.

Steam in church in the 90's.

Bell, 1892.

Arthur—St. John the Evangelist

The first church for the district was at Kenilworth, built in 1852, on land obtained in 1846.

Arthur Church was dedicated in Aug., 1858.

Laussie built the present church in 1876.

Resident Pastors:—Laussie, 1861 to Dec., 1862. Then it seems to have been attended from Kenilworth, Peel, XIII., and Mt. Forest, etc.

Laussie returned Sept., 1870 to Jan., 1882.

Doherty, P. J., May, 1882, to June, 1815.

He built the School, Convent and Rectory.

Kelly, J. T., Dean since July 1, 1815.
Many assistants came and went from 1875 to 1901, to help in Arthur and its many Missions.

AYTON—St. Peter's Church.

This is an old Mission. Its first church, a log structure, was built in the 50's; burned down later.

Resident Pastors:—Owens, P., Feb., 1882, to Nov., 1906; Wey, Jos. E., Aug., 1907, to June, 1911; Hahn, Michael S., Oct., 1911, to June, 1915; Ferguson, T. L., since July, 1915.

Rev. John J. Arnold assisted Father Owens during his illness, and had charge of the parish after his death till the appointment of Father Wey.

Father Owens built the present Church and the Rectory.

There is a rural Separate School some miles east of the village in the parish.

The deed of the church land was obtained Feb. 1, 1869, but the first church may have been erected much earlier. The cemetery was secured June 6, 1883, and well fenced, etc., by Father Hahn.

BERLIN—Sacred Heart Church (Polish).

The Polish colony began to be formed here in Jan., 1862, by Rev. Father Breitkopf, C.R., with services in St. Mary's Church. Later they had a chapel in a school hall. Since 1902 they have occupied the basement chapel of the new St. Mary's Church. Now they are beginning the erection of a new church for themselves.

They were always attended by the pastor of St. Mary's Church personally or by a priest or advanced student of the College until they were organized into a separate parish under Father Paul Sobczak.

He was indefatigable in collecting funds for the proposed church until forced by ill health to quit.

The Polish parish was organized in January, 1912.

Pastor:—Rev. Paul Sobczak, C.R., to April, 1915; Rev. Stanislaus Rogalski, C.R., since April, 1915.

Various other priests occur during Father Paul's time:

Rev. Raphael J. Chrzaszcz, C.R.
Rev. Theophile Szzpkowski, C.R.
Rev. Francis Siara, C.R.
Rev. R. C. Falinski, C.R.

Rev. Paul Sobczak also did much missionary work north in the Cobalt mining region, in Hamilton, Brantford, London, Toronto, and east as far as Cape Breton Island. He nipped several serious attempts to establish independent Polish churches in the bud.

BRANT—St. Michael's. (Bruce County.)

Settled from 1849 on.

Brant a Post Office, 1852.

Attended from Walkerton.

Brant church site secured Feb. 9, 1865.

BRANTFORD—St. Basil's Church.

Church site bought 1840.

The first (frame) church built 1840-1841.

April 17, 1861, the Oblate Fathers of Buffalo, Chevalier and Lux, gave a mission.

Brantford was attended from Niagara, Dundas and other places up to 1842.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. Dr. R. R. Mills, March, 1842, to May, 1843; Rev. M. Fergus, May, 1844; Rev. Jas. Quinlan, Oct., 1849; Rev. Jno. O'Bierne, June, 1850; Rev. P. O'Dwyer, Jan. 15, 1852; Rev. John O'Doherty, June 6, 1852; Rev. Peter Schneider, Sept., 1853; Rev. Jos. Ryan, Oct. 17, 1859; Rev. Augustine Carayon, June 14, 1868; Rev. V. Bardou, Feb. 19, 1882; Rev. Peter Lennon, Dec., 1910; Rev. Dr. R. E. M. Brady, Dean, since.

Many assistants were here, too numerous to mention.

Rev. A. Carayon erected the beautiful church.

Dean Brady renovated the church and erected a splendid school, convent and fine rectory. He added 10 acres of land to the cemetery.

Brantford—St. Mary's Church.

Church site secured April 23, 1892.

School-Church built 1892.

Parish organized July, 1898.

Present church dedicated in 1910.

Pastors:—Rev. J. P. Donovan, 1898; Rev. P. J. Cummings, Jan. 4, 1899; Rev. Francis O'Reilly, Nov., 1899, to March, 1900; Rev. P. J. Cummings, 1900 to 1910; Rev. P. J. Padden, 1910.

The school is taught by St. Joseph Sisters from St. Basil's Church.

CALEDONIA—St. Patrick's Church.

Church site secured Aug. 18, 1849.
Enlarged March 16, 1854; March 18, 1857.

Church built in 3 months; dedicated July 31, 1859, by Bishop Farrell.

This Mission was attended from various places, Niagara, Dundas, Indiana and Brantford.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. Wm. Fitzgerald, 1855 to Oct., 1859; Rev. John McNulty, 1859 to July, 1877; Rev. John P. Doherty, Aug., 1881; Rev. P. J. Madigan, May, 1885; Rev. J. T. Kelly, March, 1889; Rev. E. M. Carre, June, 1890; Rev. Francis O'Reilly, June, 1894; Rev. L. M. Lynch, Aug. 1900; Rev. Dr. A. C. Walter, July, 1901; Rev. Wm. C. Gehl, May, 1904; Rev. Geo. J. Cassidy, July, 1904.

Before the church was built Mass was said in the old theatre, then in the priest's house till it was burned; afterwards in a warehouse across the river.

From Caledonia are attended: Walpole, St. Anne's Church; Hagersville, with a new church; Binbrooke.

CAPE CROKER—St. Joseph's Church. (Indian Mission).

Since Sept. 15, 1902, with resident priest.

Rev. G. Artus, S.J., 1902 to Sept. 8, 1904; Father J. C. Cadon, S.J., since.

A fine stone church, a club hall and good school, brass band and orchestra; about 200 Catholic Indians here.

From Cape Croker are attended: Christian Island, Lion's Head, Tobermory, and the Reserve at Southampton.

CARLSRUHE—St. Francis Xavier's.

Carlsruhe became a Post Office in 1864.

The church was erected much earlier. The site was obtained Sept. 7, 1858;

enlarged Sept. 16, 1868; enlarged June 15, 1889.

The cemetery was secured Dec. 2, 1863.

The present fine church was erected in 1873 at a cost of \$15,000.

A fine stone Rectory was built later.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. F. X. Ras-saerts, March, 1865, to 1887; Rev. E. Laussie, Nov., 1887, to Oct., 1891; Rev. Dr. L. Elena, 1891 to June, 1892; Rev. Michael Hahn, Dec., 1895; Rev. Rudolph Lehmann, Aug., 1898; Rev. Jos. E. Wey, July, 1907; Rev. Jonas Lenhart ever since.

There is a fine Separate School in the village, which was formerly some distance out in the country.

Hanover is attended every Sunday and Holy Day from here.

CAYUGA—St. Stephen's Church.

In early years Indiana had a church for this section.

Site obtained July 10, 1866; enlarged Dec. 7, 1885; Feb. 8, 1875; March 1, 1887; Aug. 8, 1898; April 20, 1896.

Cemetery bought March 16, 1883.

Church was built in 1874.

The brick rectory a few years later.

Resident Priests:—Rev. Stephen Wadel, 1874 to Dec., 1878; Rev. Michael J. Cleary, 1879 to May, 1882; Rev. Peter Mary Bardou, Sept., 1893; Rev. Francis D. Kehoe, June, 1894; Very Rev. Eugene Laussie, June, 1908; Rev. Emmet A. Doyle, May, 1914; Rev. Geo. P. Murphy ever since.

Rev. J. S. O'Leary has been assistant here for many years.

CHEPSTOW—St. John Evangelist Church.

First church, of frame, built 1857; enlarged by Father Wadel.

New church built in 1903-1904; dedicated Oct. 2, 1904.

Old church dedicated by Bishop Farrell, Feb. 7, 1865.

New school built under Wadel, also a rectory.

New rectory rebuilt 1915.

Resident Priests:—Rev. Stephen Wadel, Nov., 1878, to Nov., 1900; Rev. F. X. Zenler since Dec., 1900.

Cargill Mission is attended from Chepstow in a house remodelled as a chapel.

Rev. Paul Meyer was assistant from May, 1912, to May, 1913; Rev. Wm. Goodrow since Jan., 1915.

First settler:—John Phelan.

They petitioned to call the place Emmett, but the request was refused.

DEEMERTON—St. Ignatius Church.

Church site, Dec. 24, 1857.

A log church erected by Laufhuber, 1859. Before this Mass was at Peter Emel's.

Schmitz built the stone church in 1865, and rectory.

The School-Convent was built by F. X. Messner.

Register begins Oct. 22, 1856, with Father Blettner.

Resident Priests:—Rev. Geo. Brohmann, 1880 to 1892; Rev. Jos. F. Wey, 1900; Rev. M. Halm, 1903; Rev. Clement Brohmann, 1905; Rev. Jos. F. Wey again, 1908; Rev. Alphonse Montag since.

Neustadt Mission is attended from here.

DRAYTON—St. Peter's Church.

Church site bought Nov. 15, 1898.

Church built by Rev. E. Laussie.

Kehoe built rectory and sheds and bought cemetery.

Resident Priests:—Rev. Francis D. Kehoe, Oct., 1894, to March, 1903; Rev. T. J. Heydon, C.S.B., Sept., 1910; Rev. John Arnold ever since.

From here are attended the church at Peel, Concession 13, and Palmerston.

DUNDALK—St. John's Church.

Church site secured July, 1891; added to April 28, 1894; May 1, 1894; May 12, 1894.

Church was built in 1891.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. G. P. Murphy; Rev. T. J. Clohecy since 1914.

Missions attended from here:

Melanchton, St. Lawrence Church; Osprey, Proton, St. Patrick's Church; Shelburne.

DUNDAS—St. Augustine's Church.

Church site secured Dec. 27, 1849; added to July 30, 1851; March 15, 1883; April 5, 1873; Oct. 24, 1873; Oct. 16, 1856.

The first church was erected very early, likely before 1830.

Quasi-resident Priests:—Rev. James Campion, 1828 to 1829; Rev. John Cullen, 1830 to 1832.

Resident Priests:—Rev. John Cassidy, Dec., 1839; Rev. John Fox, 1840; Rev. Dr. M. R. Mills, 1842; Rev. James O'Flynn, May, 1842; Rev. Peter Connolly, June, 1843; Rev. Patrick O'Dwyer, May, 1845; Rev. J. O'Reilly, 1885; Very Rev. John Keough, V.-G., 1889; Very Rev. E. I. Heenan, V.-G., 1898; Very Rev. E. Laussie, June, 1909; Rev. J. J. Feeny since July, 1909.

Dundas may be considered as the mother church of the Diocese.

DUNNVILLE—St. Michael's Church.

The district was mostly attended from Caledonia until 1886.

The first log or frame church was built under Father John McNulty about 1860, on a lot leased for the purpose, the one where now stands the rectory. The present site of the church was secured July 21, 1871.

Very Rev. Dean T. J. Kelly began the erection of the handsome brick church in 1886. While under construction Rev. J. E. Crinnon was appointed its first pastor from Sept., 1886, to 1903. The church was dedicated May 10, 1887.

Rev. G. J. Cleary succeeded till 1904; Rev. P. J. Donovan, 1906; Rev. Jos. Englert, 1907; Rev. P. J. Donovan again since 1908.

He had the church beautifully decorated and furnished and the rectory renovated.

DURHAM—St. Philips'.

Lot No. 5, E. side of Albert Street, March 1, 1857.

Father Maloney resided here.

Father Hanck moved the priest's home to Markdale.

The Mission seems to be on the increase.

WOOLWICH—St. Theresa—(Elmira.)

Settled about 1840.

Church site bought March 10, 1853. Church was finished by Father Holzer in 1849.

Attended from St. Clement's, New Germany and Berlin.

In June, 1888, a site for a new church was bought at Elmira.

A good brick church was built in 1889 by Father Foerster, of New Germany.

The church is attended from Berlin. The old Woolwich Church was dismantled, but the site remains as the Elmira Cemetery.

Rev. A. L. Zinger has had charge since 1914.

ELORA—Immaculate Conception.

Elora had a church very early, 1851, between the Grand Trunk Railway station and the town.

The present church site was secured Jan. 17, 1871, and a substantial brick church erected on it soon after as well as a brick presbytery.

The old school was a lean-to behind the church. The present neat school is opposite the church.

Pastors:—Rev. P. S. Owens, 1872 to May, 1876; Rev. J. J. Lee, Sept., 1885; Rev. J. F. Lennon, Dec., 1886; Rev. P. Cosgrove, Sept., 1911; Rev. A. Parker, Feb., 1912; Rev. N. L. Sullivan since.

Salem was an important Mission Station early, but the railway left it away behind.

Fergus is attended from here.

FERGUS—Holy Family Church.

This is also a very old Mission with an early church.

The present stone church, a substantial building, and erected before the Elora church. Fergus also has had a Separate School early.

The priest of Elora attends here every Sunday and Holiday.

FORMOSA—Mary Immaculate.

Began to be settled in 1852-3-4.

Road laid out through Carriack (Elora) in 1851-52. The Township surveyed in 1852.

Became a Post Office in 1862, with F. X. Messner as Postmaster.

The old frame church erected by Blettner or Laufhuber. The present church was built over the old one in many years. It was dedicated Dec. 9, 1883.

The deed for the church site obtained Nov. 23, 1864, but the church was built long before; also the school. Rebuilt in stone later.

The Mother Church of Bruce and part of Grey Counties.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. A. Gstir, Sept., 1861, to March, 1865; Very Rev. J. Jos. Schmitz, Dean, Nov., 1872; Very Rev. J. Keough, V.-G., Sept., 1873; Rev. Jos. Muobis, Sept., 1874; Very Rev. Dr. L. Elena, V.-G., 1893; Rev. Jos. F. Wey, Administrator, 1888 to 1891; Rev. Geo. Brohmann, 1891 to 1897; Very Rev. John Gehl, Dean, June, 1915; Rev. Clement Brohmann, Aug., 1915.

Formosa had a school early.

The convent was built in 1872, and occupied since by the Sisters of Notre Dame.

There are several rural Separate Schools in the parish, one of the most compactly Catholic in the Province.

The church is one of the most handsome and one of the largest country churches in the Province, beautifully decorated and well furnished, lately with steam heating.

FREELTON—Mt. Carmel Church.

Site secured July 26, 1865; enlarged Nov. 10, 1876; good stone church built in the 60's; burnt under O'Leary. Rebuilt and Sanctuary and Vestries added. There is a good brick rectory.

Cemetery at the church well laid out and kept.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. William Lillis, Aug., 1877, to June, 1882; Rev. J. S. O'Leary, Aug., 1894; Rev. Geo. P. Murphy, July, 1901; Rev. E. A. Doyle, Nov., 1908; Rev. T. L. Ferguson, July, 1909; Rev. Wm. Becker since July, 1909.

Waterdown is attended from here.

GALT—St. Patrick's Church.

Attended from Niagara and Dundas, 1827 to 1833; from St. Agatha to 1847; from New Germany to 1852; from Brantford and Paris to 1864; from Paris to 1876.

First Resident Pastor, Jeremiah Ryan, 1879; from Paris, to 1880.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. Mich. J. Maguire, to Oct., 1885; Rev. Patrick McCann, to Jan., 1886; Rev. B. J. O'Connell, to Aug., 1889; Rev. R. T. Burke, to July, 1890; Rev. P. Slaven, to Aug., 1899; Rev. John J. Craven, to April, 1914; Rev. Emmett A. Doyle since.

The first church was built by Father Holzer during the latter 50's; dedicated by Bishop Farrell, 1860.

The second church was erected under Rev. T. J. Dowling in 1880.

GUELPH—Our Lady Immaculate.

The Guelph church site was obtained from the Canada Company by Bishop MacDonell on his visit there in 1827, soon after the founding of the town by Mr. Galt on April 3, 1827.

Missionaries:—Rev. James Campion, 1827 to 1830; Rev. Father Cassidy, 1833; Rev. John Cullen, May, 1833.

Both Fathers Cassidy and Cullen lived in Guelph some time.

Resident Priests:—Rev. Thomas Gibney, 1837 to Oct., 1846; Rev. Simon Sanderl, C.S.S.R., 1846 to 1850; Rev. John Cullen, 1850 to 1852; Rev. John Holzer, S.J., Jan., 1852, to Nov., 1863.

The Jesuit Fathers have been in Guelph ever since and attended for a number of years Missions south, east, west, and particularly north to Lake Huron and Georgian Bay, so that Guelph is really the Mother Church of all the churches in Wellington, Bruce and the greater part of Grey Counties.

Father Cullen reports building the first church in Guelph May 13, 1833.

Father Cassidy had reported the purchase of a house Jan. 28, 1833 (Kings-ton Archives).

The Guelph church was burned Oct. 10, 1844, and rebuilt by Father Gibney in stone. It was dedicated Aug. 30, 1846.

The corner stone of Father Holzer's proposed church was laid Oct. 8, 1863.

The corner stone of the present church was laid July 4, 1877; dedicated Aug. 25, 1878. The completed church was dedicated Oct. 10, 1888.

Father Holzer began the Loretto Academy June 10, 1856.

St. Joseph's Hospital and House of Providence, 1861; Separate Schools, 1853.

Note.—So many priests came here and left, that only a Jesuit can give the regular succession of pastors for this parish after Father Holzer's term.

Unfortunately the valuable records of the parish were destroyed with the church in 1844.

The first Catholic school here was opened in Jan., 1854, with 150 children.

HAMILTON—Old St. Mary's Church.

June 24, 1827, Bishop McDonell reports the church under roof, but unfinished inside.

It was burnt down Tuesday, August 30, 1859; no insurance, loss \$20,000.

The corner stone of the present Cathedral was laid Oct. 9, 1859, just 40 days after the destruction of the old church.—(Mirror, Spectator, Canadian Freeman.)

St. Mary's Cathedral.

Corner stone laid Oct. 9, 1859, by Bishop Farrell praesentibus, Gordon, Carayon, Holzer, O'Reilly, Maheut, Sherry; F. C. Kortum, Architect; Father McGinnis, of Holy Angels, Preacher.

Dedicated May 21, 1860; Bishop Timon, Preacher; present: Lynch, Walsh, Farrell, Ottawa.

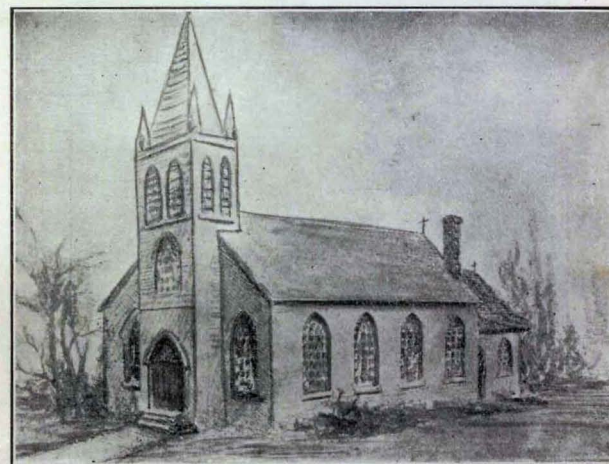
Renovated under Father McEvay.

Decorated, etc., for the Jubilee, 1906.

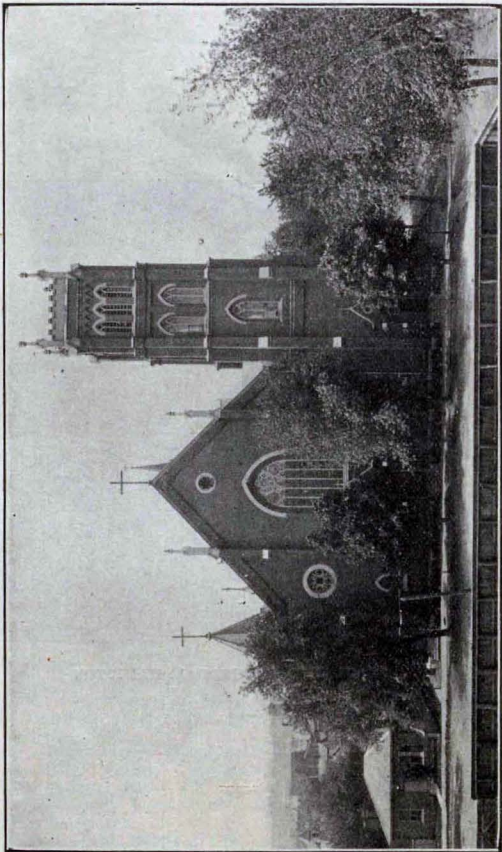
Consecrated, May 20, 1906.

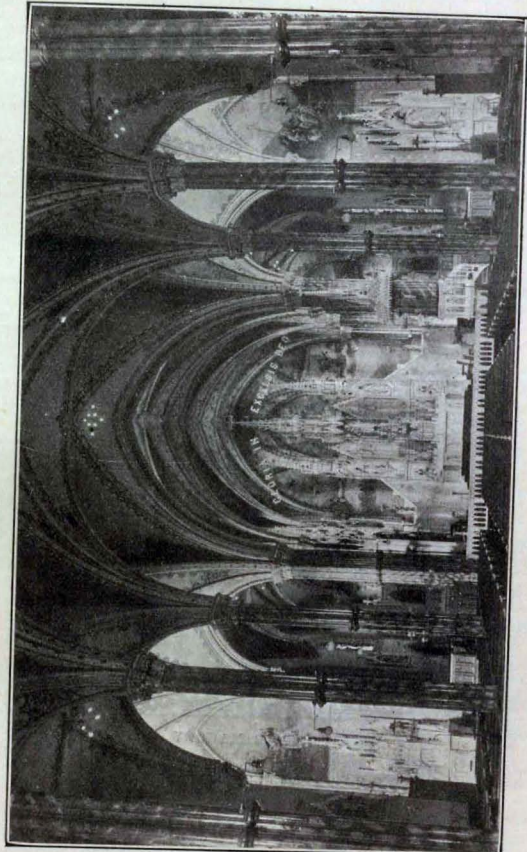
Most of the priests coming into or ordained for the Diocese served for a shorter or longer term at the Cathedral. The list is too long to be given here.

Site procured Feb. 23, 1873, for \$10,000.

Church built 1877.

Rectory built by Father Coty.

Splendid school erected 1915.

Priests:—Rev. P. Lennon, July 22, 1877; Rev. J. Keough, Dec., 1877, to May, 1885; Rev. J. J. Craven, Nov., 1880, to March, 1899; Rev. M. J. Cleary, May, 1885, to Dec., 1885; Rev. B. Cosgrove, Jan., 1886, to July, 1887; Rev. J. J. Murphy, July, 1887, to April, 1888; Rev. J. J. Tuohy, May, 1888, to June, 1889; Rev. J. T. Kelly, June, 1889, to June, 1890; Rev. P. St. Lawrence Church.

Site purchased Feb. 25, 1882, for \$1,862.

Parish organized in 1890.

Church consecrated by Archbishop Joseph Weber, C.R., of Berlin, June 6, 1909.

Fine rectory built by Father Brady.

Pastors:—Rev. Geo. O'Sullivan, Nov., 1890, to Dec., 1891; Very Rev. Dr. Brady, Dean, 1891, to March, 1911; Rev. John F. Hinchey ever since.

St. Joseph's Church.

The site secured Sept. 1, 1890; Sept. 3, 1890; Sept. 19, 1890.

Church built in 1894.

Rectory purchased soon after.

Pastors:—Rev. John Hinchey, 1894 to 1902; Rev. P. J. Donovan, 1902 to 1903; Rev. Ph. Hanck, 1903 to May, 1904; Rev. Wm. C. Gehl, March, 1906; Rev. P. J. Holden, July, 1909; Rev. A. J. Leyes ever since.

St. Anne's Church.

The site was secured —.

The church was erected in 1906; dedicated May 13, 1906.

Rectory built, 1907.

Pastors:—Rev. Jonas Lenhart, May, 1906, to Aug., 1907; Rev. Jos. Englert since Aug., 1907.

School erected in 1908; opened in 1909. A new school built lately.

St. Stanislaus' Church.

The Polish congregation was organized by Father Paul Sobczak, C.R., of Berlin, in Oct., 1909, and had services in St. Ann's till Feb. 18, 1912, when they moved into their new church near St. Ann's.

Pastors:—Rev. Paul Sobczak, C.R., from 1909 to April, 1911; Rev. T. Tarasiuk ever since.

St. Anthony's Church.

The Italians also used St. Ann's Church as well as the Cathedral chapel until they obtained a church of their own not far from St. Anne's, April 7, 1912.

Pastor:—Rev. J. T. Bonomi.

Chapel of St. Thomas Aquinas.

On Dundurn and Marguerite Streets. It is attended from the Cathedral.

Sacred Heart Chapel.

On the Mountain. Is attended from St. Patrick's Church.

Cemetery.

St. Mary's Cemetery, on the Brantford Road, was bought early; later sold to the city. Re-purchased Dec. 31, 1906.

Calvary Cemetery, purchased by Bishop Crinnon, Sept. 28, 1874, over 60 acres on Burlington Bay, \$8,000. Beautifully laid out and well kept.

HANOVER—Holy Trinity Church.

Had a log or frame church early in 1852, but it was abandoned and torn down. Services re-opened in Post Hall, Nov. 15, 1896.

Old Protestant church bought March 3, 1897.

Holy Trinity Church built in 1912.

Separate School opened Feb., 1912. Is attended from Carlsruhe.

The log church site was squatted on by someone and thus lost.

Holyrood, attended from Teeswater.

Under Father Kehoe, who reorganized the parish and erected the buildings.

KINCARDINE—St. Anthony of Padua.

Village surveyed in 1849, the Township in 1850. Received a Post Office in 1851.

Church site bought May 25, 1858. Church of frame built 20 ft. x 30 ft. Dedicated by Bishop Farrell in honour of St. John and St. Ann, Feb. 3, 1867 or 1863. Is attended from Teeswater.

MARKDALE—St. Joseph's.

Church site, Jan. 3, 1901; added to July 24, 1908.

Pastors:—Rev. R. G. Maloney, 1890 to 1896; Rev. Phil. Hanck, 1903; Rev. A. C. Walter, 1908; Rev. A. J. Savage, 1909; Rev. J. J. Flahavan, 1910.

MILDMAY—Sacred Heart Church.

Site secured July 29, 1878; added to in 1883, 1887, 1892, 1898, 1901, 1915. First church built 1877.

Post Office in 1868.

Convent-School built in 1879.

Register begins Jan. 20, 1895, by Father Brohmann, then at Formosa.

Halm first resident pastor, 1895 to 1903; R. Lehmann, 1913; C. Brohmann, locum tenens, 1912, about 2 months Montag from Deemerton; Halm again since Aug., 1915.

Rev. Brohmann while resident in Deemerton built the rectory; also procured the bell.

A Separate Convent was bought, but sold again in 1915, and another one by the school bought.

Father Geo. Brohmann bought the cemetery.

Father Lehmann built the fine new church in 1914-15.

MOUNT FOREST—Church of the Purification.

A log church erected by Blettner below the village in 1857, but was destroyed by fire before completed.

The present church was erected under Father Maheut about 1863-64; burned again under O'Connell; rebuilt by him. He also built the present rectory.

A school-convent was built in 1908.

Dean Kelly secured the bell.

Father Dumortier, S.J., begins the Register Sept. 4, 1856.

NEUSTADT.

Church site bought by Laufhuber in 1859.

Church (frame) built by Laufhuber in 1860; sold later.

A new chapel was built later on a different site.

Is attended from Deemerton, previously from Carlsruhe and then from Aytton.

OAKVILLE—St. Andrew's.

Site Nov. 19, 1855; Lots A. B. C. in Block 35; added to April 11, 1867, Lots C. and F. in Block 77.

Cemetery, 1 acre, Lot 16, Concession 3, Trafalgar Township, Nov. 20, 1856.

The old church, roughcast, built in 1831; recently thoroughly renovated and grounds much improved.

The old brick rectory was also thoroughly overhauled. There is an old Separate School in Oakville taught by a school-ma'am.

Oakville was attended from Toronto, the Toronto Gore, Dundas, Hamilton.

Pastors:—Rev. J. Ryan, Sept., 1859, to April, 1876; Rev. R. R. Morris, May, 1878; Rev. Terence O'Reilly, March, 1884; Rev. E. P. Slaven, July, 1890; Rev. J. T. Kelly, Oct., 1892; Rev. R. T. Burke, April, 1900; Rev. Francis O'Reilly, Feb., 1905; Rev. J. J. Feeny, April, 1909; Rev. A. J. Savage ever since.

From Oakville are attended: Milton, Holy Rosary Church. Church site secured in 1879.

Trafalgar, St. Peter's. Site secured in 1837.

Burlington, St. John the Baptist. Site secured June 17, 1839; a part in Dec., 1832. It has a good brick church.

OWEN SOUND—Church of the Assumption.

A very old stone church stood where the convent now stands, later used as a school.

New church site secured across the road from the first church.

New church built on Lot No. 1.

Rectory and gardens belong to Father Granottier.

A fine school and convent are on the old church site; belong to the School Board.

St. Joseph Sisters had the school, 1886 to 1909. Now the Notre Dame Sisters have it since 1913.

The Mission was attended early from Penetanguishene, later by the Jesuits from Guelph.

Father Blettner begins the Register Jan. 18, 1857.

Resident Pastors:—Rev. V. Bardon, April, 1859; Rev. P. St. Aubin, 1859 to 1861; Rev. P. S. Maheut, July, 1861, to July, 1863. Since July 19, 1863, the Basilians have had charge of Owen Sound, Grey, and parts of Bruce.

This is an old Mission; was attended from different places at various times, later from Dundas, and still later from Brantford.

Church dedicated 1858.

Louis Bissey, pastor, bought rectory.

Pastors:—Rev. Peter Schneider; Rev. J. Ryan, 1853 to 1857; Rev. L. Bissey, 1859; Rev. Wm. Fitzgerald, 1860; Rev. N. McKee, 1862; Very Rev. E. Laussie, 1864; Rt. Rev. T. J. Dowling, Feb., 1887; Rev. T. Tully and Rev. Patrick McCann, briefly; Rev. B. J. O'Connell, Sept., 1887, to May, 1888; Rev. J. E. Crinnon, Aug., 1908; Rev. Wm. Becker, Dec., 1909; Rev. Geo. L. Cassidy since.

Many Missions were attended from Paris, such as Galt, Preston and Hesperler.

The Separate School is of early date and taught by the St. Joseph Sisters since Father Bissey's time, 1858.

Father Dowling erected the spacious stone rectory, the beautiful stone church and assisted lately in completing it and erecting a fine new school. He also attended to the erection of the present Galt church while pastor of Paris.

PEEL XII.—Holy Family.

Old log or frame church built in 1852. Laussie built a good brick church.

Mostly attended from Macton, Arthur, later Drayton, now almost abandoned. The people have to go to Drayton.

A rural Separate School in its limits. The church cost \$5,200, besides labor and material given gratis.

Very Rev. E. Laussie lived here from 1859 to 1861, and attended Macton, Arthur, etc., from here.

This old church was built by Father Holzer in 1850 with funds received from a benefactor in Styria. It was dedicated to St. Antony.

Site secured, Lot 21, Concession 3, March 14, 1879; Lot No. 22 (½-acre), Concession 4, Jan. 8, 1881; one acre, Lot 24, Concession 3; part of lot 231, Concession 2, 1 acre, May 12, 1894; part of lot 24, Concession 3, March 28, 1898. Attended from Dundalk.

RAINHAM.

Site, 1 acre, Lot No. 6, Concession 3, secured Nov. 13, 1844.

Frame or log church built soon after. School organized by the Jesuits about 1848.

Both school and church abandoned about 1864.

The last priest visiting here seems to have been Father J. Jos. Schmitz.

RIVERDALE—St. Michael's Church.

Church site secured Nov. 9, 1860 and Nov. 29, 1860. Frame church built soon after.

Was attended from Formosa, now from Teeswater.

Had Revs. H. Kelly and St. Aubin as resident priests around the 60's. Church dedicated Feb. 5, 1865.

Separate School organized.

Church dedicated by Bishop Farrell.

Attended by Father Wadel, then from Walkerton to the present time.

TEESWATER—Sacred Heart Church.

Site: Lot 316, Aug. 25, 1876; Lot No. 11, Gordon Street, 1882; Lot No. 226, 1882.

Attended formerly from Formosa and Riverdale.

Resident Priests:—Father Corcoran, 1877 to 1910; Rev. Capps in charge since.

Pastor attends Riverdale, Holy Rood and Kincardine.

WATERDOWN—Church of St. Francis.

A small, poor stone church was erected in 1846.

The old church was dedicated by Very Rev. Wm. P. McDonald, V.-G.; Fathers O'Dwyer and Wm. McIntosh, June 16, 1864.—(Mirror.)

Attended from Dundas, Oakville and Hamilton; from Freelon since it had a resident priest.

In 1914-15 a handsome brick church was erected on a more central site.

WALKERTON—Church of the Sacred Heart.

Site: Lots 62-65, James Street, Feb. 7, 1872; Lot No. 117, Victoria Street, Oct. 8, 1889.

Church was held early in private houses and public halls.

Church built 1872.

Separate School organized Dec. 30, 1891.

Cemetery is a part of the public one, 1879.

The W. G. and B. Railway came in 1872; the C.P.R. in 1906.

Walkerton settled in 1849, when the Durham Road was opened.

Walker came in 1850. Post Office, 1851.

Walkerton County Town in 1867.

Incorporated 1871 as a town, not having been incorporated as a village. It had then 995 souls; 1891 it had 3,061; in 1901 it had 2,971. In 1858 it had only 175 souls.

Present Town Hall built in 1897.

Of Bally Shannon, Donegal Co., Ireland. Studied at Glengarry. Ordained in Kingston in 1831; at Niagara, at St. Catharines, 1832 to 1837, to 1844; missionary north to Dundas, Guelph, etc., 1832 to 1833. Bought a house (rectory) in Guelph, Jan. 28, 1833, but soon after ceased going to Guelph. Returned to Ireland in 1844.

Some time in 1833 a Guelph gentleman wrote to the Bishop that Father Cassidy would not have any further service for Guelph.

He later became very devout and thoroughly Catholic. He was a fine man and a capital preacher, and the Protestants tried hard to get him, but in vain. He had one failing.

He did much missionary work north to Arthur and Mount Forest, etc.; south to Rainham, etc. He finished the Woolwich Church in 1849; saved the Guelph Church from being sold for a debt of \$3,000 in 1852, and started the Galt Church. He also saved another church (probably Ayr). He had planned a church to rival Notre Dame of Montreal; laid the corner stone for it Oct. 8, 1863, and then broke down from overwork. The cost of the church was estimated at \$100,000. Holzer built the tower on Gibney's church; procured a large bell for it; erected the building for St. Ignatius College; brought the Loretto Nuns to Guelph to open their academy and teach the girls in the Separate School; started a Separate School for the boys; brought the St. Joseph Sisters to Guelph to open the hospital and the House of Providence. He built or finished many churches, e.g., New Germany, Woolwich, Peel XII., Kenilworth, Mt. Forest, Hanover, etc., etc. Had his health not broken down he might have completed the Guelph Church as he had planned it. But alas! the foundation was afterwards torn up and the material used for the present church that was built piecemeal. Holzer's last baptisms in Guelph was in Nov., 1863. He revisited Guelph later on three different occasions in the 70's. He died April 27, 1888, at Georgetown, D.C., U.S.A. (Pages 22, 58, 59.)

Born at Armagh, Ireland, June 14, 1846; at Montreal College and Seminary; ordained at London, June 30, 1873; at Hamilton Cathedral, assistant, 1874; at Brantford, pastor, 1882 to 1916. Retired to House of Providence, Dundas, in 1910.

LEVEQUE, ZEPHIRIN, Rev., S.J.

Born at Rivière-Ouelle, Q., Jan. 6, 1806. Ordained at Quebec, Jan. 6, 1831; at Hamilton July 23, 1848, to 1861; went to Boston, 1861. Died Feb. 13, 1862.

LEVERMAN, CHARLES W., Rev., O.S.B.

Born in Strassburg, Alsace, Feb. 19, 1829. Came in early youth with parents to Halifax, N.S.; to St. Agatha in the later 50's as teacher; at St. Michael's College, Toronto, as teacher and student; at Berlin, teacher and professor, 1863 to 1868; at Montreal Seminary, briefly, in 1871; at Benedictine Abbey, Beatty, Pa., 1871 or 1872; ordained Jan., 1873; solemn vows, Aug. 15, 1877; at Chicago, assistant at St. Joseph's Church; in Kansas College and Missions, 1874 to 1877; at Allegany, Pa., assistant, 1877 to 1888; at Greensburg, Pa., pastor, 1889 to 1892; at the Beatty Monastery, 1892 to 1895. Died there March 19, 1899. (Pages 40, 41, 126.)

LEYES, ALBAN J., Rev.

Born in Baden, Ont., Nov. 3, 1879. At St. Jerome's College, Berlin, 1896 to 1901; at the Grand Seminary, Montreal, 1901 to 1904; ordained at Berlin, Ont., Dec. 17, 1904; assistant at Dundas, 1907; assistant at the Cathedral, 1909; pastor of St. Joseph's, Hamilton, since. Secretary to His Lordship.

LHIVER, L. A., Rev.

A Normand. Came to Hamilton Diocese from Nova Scotia. At Hamilton June 23, 1873; at Macton Oct. 13, 1873.

to March 23, 1876; at Riversdale about 6 months; at Teeswater, 1878; went west. Died recently in North Dakota.

LIGMAN, THADDEUS, Rev., C.R.

Born Nov. 16, 1880, at Lobvenica, Posen. Entered the C.R. Oct. 10, 1901; vows Aug. 15, 1906; ordained April 18, 1908; at Chicago, 1910; at Berlin, 1912 to 1914; at Chicago since.

LILLIS, WILLIAM, Rev.

Born in Diocese of Cloyne, Cork Co. Ordained in Ireland; to Hamilton with Father Lee, 1874 (?); at Freelon, first resident pastor, Aug. 27, 1877, to June, 1882; returned to Ireland; still pastor of Bellin Dangan, Cork Co., Cloyne Diocese, Mitchellstown P.O.

LOPINTO, FREDERIC M., S.J.

Born May 16, 1827. Entered July 30, 1844; ordained in or before 1860; at Quebec 1880 to 1881; at Guelph 1881; at Montreal, 1882 to 1886. Died at Posilippo, near Naples, Sept. 12, 1909.

LORY, HIPPOLITUS, S.J.

Born April 25, 1830, at Fleury, Yonne, France. Entered Aug. 14, 1851. At Guelph Sept., 1882, to Aug., 1884, pastor; at St. Boniface, 1888. Died at Pau, Mary 1, 1891, aged 61 years.

LOYZANCE, JOS. P., S.J.

Born March 12, 1820. Entered Nov. 24, 1849; at Guelph, pastor, Aug. 13, 1873, to July 30, 1874. Died at Worcester, Mass., Feb. 23, 1897, aged 77 years.

LYNCH, L. M., Rev.

Born 1841, in Quebec Province. At St. Patrick's, Hamilton, Nov., 1891, to March, 1894; at Caledonia, 1904. Died at St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton, on Good Friday, 1904. Is said to have founded two religious communities in Quebec.

MCCANN, P.

At Hamilton, Oct. 14, 1885; at Galt, Nov., 1885, to Jan., 1886; at Walkerton, May, 1887, to May, 1889; at Paris, briefly; went west. Died in California.

MCCARTHY, F.

At St. Jerome's College, 1909; at Seminary; ordained June 29, 1915; at St. Patrick's, Hamilton, July, 1915.

MCDONALD, JOHN, S.J.

At Guelph, April 25, 1885, to July 12, 1888. Died Sept. 1, 1907, at Montreal, aged 67.

MACDONALD, WM. PETER, Very Rev., V.-G.

Born in Scotland, 1771. Studied at Douay and Valladolid. Ordained at Valladolid Nov. 29, 1790; 12 years on Scottish Missions in the British Diplomatic Service; in Kingston 1830; at Prescott later; at Hamilton Nov. 9, 1838, to June 28, 1859; at Hamilton, V.-G., May 10, 1846. He published The Catholic in Kingston, 1830, later in Hamilton 1841 to 1844. In 1846 he went to Toronto. Died in St. Michael's Palace, Toronto, April 2, 1847. Buried in the Cathedral, Toronto.

MACDONELL, ALEXANDER, Rt. Rev., D.D.

Born July 17, 1762, at Glen Urquhart, Invernesshire, Scotland. Studied at Douay and the Scottish College, Pau and Valladolid; ordained at Valladolid, Spain, Feb. 16, 1787; 4 or 5 years on Scottish Missions; Chaplain at Glasgow 1792 to 1794; chaplain of Scottish Regiment at Guernsey Islands, 1795; chaplain of the Highlanders in Ireland, 1798 to 1802; sent his Highlanders to Canada and followed them in 1803; at St. Raphael's, Ont., 1803; Vic.-Gen., 1807; covered the whole settled province as missionary; appointed Bishop I.P.I., Vicar Apostolic for Upper Canada, Jan. 12, 1819; Bishop of Regiopolis (Kingston), Feb. 14, 1826; in 1827 he made his great official visit to Toronto, Dundas, Niagara, St. Thomas, Sandwich, etc., also to Guelph, where he received from Mr. Galt the hill for a church site, and met him again at St. Thomas and Sandwich. He died in England Jan. 14, 1840. (Pages 7 and 8.)

MACDONELL, ANGUS, Rev.

Born at Glengarry, Ont., 1791. Ordained at Glengarry, 1822; pastor of Glengarry, 1822 to 1829; pastor and missionary of Bytown, 1829 to 1831 or 1832; at Sandwich, 1831 to 1843, where he began to build the church finished by the Jesuits; at St. Andrew's, Glengarry, in Bishop Macdonell's time before Fathers Frazer, O'Meara and Geo. Hay. This church is said in 1836 to be a large building.

MACDONELL, EUGENE.

At Oakville just before Father O'Flynn came to Dundas, likely from the Gore or Toronto.

MCDONOUGH, W. PATRICK.

Ordained in Rome shortly before coming to Canada from the Diocese of Tuam, Ireland. First at York after O'Grady; pastor of St. Catharines, 1842 to 1851. He laid the corner stone of

the present church there, May 25, 1843; at Toronto, Kingston, Douro; attended Oakville, where he is said to have had the first Mass in 1836. He erected the church at Oakville and said the first Mass in it in 1840. He died at Douro in 1863.

McEVAY, FERGUS P., Rev.

Pastor of Ops and Emily, March, 1845; at Hamilton (as a visitor) early.

McEVAY, FERGUS PATRICK, Most Rev., D.D.

Born at Lindsay, 1856. Ordained at Trenton, 1882; at Peterboro, 1889; at Hamilton, 1889 to 1899; Bishop of London, Aug. 6, 1899 to 1908; Archbishop of Toronto, June 17, 1908, to 1911. Died May 10, 1911.

Studied at St. Michael's College, Toronto, and Toronto University; at the Grand Seminary, Montreal, at various parishes of Peterboro Diocese; rector of the Peterboro Cathedral, 1887; rector of Hamilton Cathedral, 1889 and V.-G. and Mgr.

McGINN, W. J., Rev.

At Hamilton Cathedral, 1880 to 1882. Died of consumption at Hamilton, Oct. 8, 1883, aged 33 years.

McGOEY, SYLVESTER.

Born at Macton, Feb. 12, 1889. At St. Jerome's 1904 to 1909; at Seminary, 1909 to 1911; ordained Dec. 20, 1913; at St. Patrick's, 1914. (Page 173.)

McINTOSH, ANGUS, Rev.

Born July 19, 1865, at Arthur. At St. Jerome's College; at the Grand Seminary, Montreal; ordained May 27, 1888. Died at St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton, March 31, 1889. Buried at Arthur.

McINTOSH, WILLIAM, C.C., Rev.

Born at Tongue, Sunderlandshire, Scotland, in August, 1808. A convert in 1824; ordained at Presholme in August, 1835; to Canada in 1843; at Hamilton Aug. 12, 1843, to Sept. 22, 1846; at Indiana, Caledonia, Dunnville, etc., as missionary, 1842 to 1848. Said the first Mass at Dunnville, 1848, in Mrs. McKeever's house (Donovan).

McKEE, N., Rev.

At Paris July 14, 1860, to Nov. 1, 1862; left for Philadelphia (Bishop Dowling).

McKINNON, DOUGALD.

A native of Nova Scotia. Died of pulmonary consumption at Hamilton, Sept. 8, 1883. Buried in the priests' plot, Hamilton.

McLAUGHLIN, MICHAEL, Rev.

First resident pastor of Thorold, 1852; missionary in Indiana, Dunnville, 1852 to 1853.

McNULTY, JOHN, Rev.

Born March 17, 1804, in Mayo Co. Ordained by Bishop Dubois, of New York, in 1834; at Toronto, 5th line, Dixie, etc.; at Caledonia, Nov. 2, 1858, to July 9, 1877; at Indiana, Cayuga, etc.; at Dunnville, 1858 to 1860. He built the first church in Dunnville. Furnished the funds in part to purchase the House of Providence, to which he retired. He died therein Sept. 30, 1882, and was buried on the lawn of the institution. He also attended Thornhill, 1853 to 1858.

McNULTY, NEIL JEROME, Rev., C.S.B.

Born at Norwood, Ont., Oct. 14, 1864. Studied at Norwood High School; taught school 4 years; then at St. Michael's College, Toronto, and Assumption College; ordained Jan. 6, 1902; at Amherstburg, Ont.; Houston, Tex.; at Owen Sound since 1909.

McQUAID, JOHN, Rev. S.J.

At Guelph Jan. 3, 1860, to July, 1862; again Aug. 13, 1865, to April 27, 1868. Died at Boston, Mass., April 8, 1904.

McREAVY, FATHER.

Born June 28, 1888, in the Irish Block, Grey Co. At college, St. Michael's, Toronto; at Seminary, Grand, Montreal; ordained May 29, 1915; at Cathedral, 1915.

MADDIGAN, P. J., Rev.

Born in the Toronto Gore, 1844. Moved to Caledonia, 1851; ordained with Father Wadel, July 13, 1873; at the Cathedral, July 20, 1873, to Oct., 1877; at Walkerton, pastor, 1877, to 1881; at Formosa, assistant; at House of Providence, Dundas, since 1915.

MAGUIRE, MICHAEL, Rev.

At St. Patrick's, Hamilton, 1877; at Galt, Nov. 12, 1880, to Oct. 23, 1885. Died at Guelph, Oct. 23, 1885. Buried at Guelph.

MAHEUT, P. S., Rev.

A native of Bretagne or Normandy. To Hamilton Diocese in 1857; at Hamilton Feb. 20, 1859, to June 15, 1861; at Owen Sound July 21, 1861, to July 19, 1863; at Mount Forest Aug., 1863, to Sept. 16, 1870; at Macton Oct., 1870, to June 1, 1872; from Hamilton he attended Waterdown, etc., from 1859 to 1861.

On his way to France he had to stop at McSweeney's Hotel, N.Y., with his sister, and died in the hotel June 19, 1872. Was buried through charity by some New York pastors. In 1868 he visited his old home and brought along his sister to keep house for him. His sister seems to have been at home in Havre. (Pages 171, 172.)

MAHONY, JOHN, Very Rev., V.-G., Mgr., and LL.D.

Born near Hamilton; taught school; at St. Jerome's College and the Grand Seminary, Montreal; assistant at the Cathedral; rector at the Cathedral since Aug., 1899.

MALONE, TIMOTHY, Rev., Ex-S.J.

Born at St. Columban's, Ont., London Diocese, May 23, 1866. Seaford High School, 1882 to 1884; public school teacher 8 years at McKillop No. 5; at St. Jerome's College, Jan., 1888, to July, 1889; at the Jesuits, Montreal; ordained June 30, 1901, at Montreal; at St. Mary's College, Montreal, 1901 to 1903; Bursar of Loyola College, 1907 to 1910; pastor of Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., 1910 to 1912; pastor of Guelph (June 15, 1910) 1912 to 1914; assistant at Fort Rouge, Winnipeg; pastor at Vancouver, B.C.; at present in Kentucky (1915).

MALONEY, RICHARD D., Rev.

Born at Acton, Feb. 23, 1867; at Guelph; at St. Jerome's College; at the Jesuits, Montreal, 1884; at the Grand Seminary, Montreal; at Hamilton; at Markdale, Durham, etc., July, 1890, to March 21, 1896. Died near Markdale, March 19, 1896. Buried at Markdale.

MALONEY, P. J.

At St. Michael's College; at the Grand Seminary, Montreal; ordained Aug. 18, 1910; at Cathedral since.

MARIVAU, THOMAS.

Came under Bishop De Charbonnel, 1856; in Toronto Diocese in 1850 (De Charbonnel); at Hamilton, Oct. 3, 1851.

MARSHALL or MARECHAL, FRANCIS, S.J.

Born March 4, 1827, at St. Cassin, Savoy; entered Oct. 14, 1852; at Guelph Sept., 1854, to 1860. Burned to a cinder in a railway accident at Springtenduffel, near New York, Jan. 13, 1882.

MATOGA, CASPAR, Rev., S.J.

Born Dec. 30, 1823, at Siepraw, Galicia, Austria. Entered the S.J.S. Aug. 11, 1839, in Galicia; in Guelph Sept. 4, 1852. Missionary in Northern Welling-

ton, Bruce and Grey soon after coming to Guelph and continued faithfully to make wonderful tours, mostly on foot, till afflicted on one of them with a throat disease (likely diphtheria) about 30 miles from Guelph. He walked home and arrived there speechless, and remained so until his death, on Aug. 21, 1856. Buried in Guelph.

MAURICE or MORRIS, R. R., M.D., Dr., and LL.D. (?)

A native of England, and a convert. To Hamilton about 1856 (Bishop De Charbonnel); at Hamilton from Nov. 11, 1866, to Aug. 25, 1867; at Arthur from 1867 to 1870; at Mount Forest Oct., 1870, to May 14, 1876; at Oakville May, 1876, to 1878, when he returned to England.

MAYER, WILBERT, C.R., Ph.D., D.D.

Born in New Dundee, Ont., June 2, 1888; at St. Jerome's; entered C.R. Sept., 1908; at Rome 1916; ordained at Rome, Dec. 19, 1914; at St. Jerome's College July, 1916.

MESSNER, COLUMBAN, Rev., O.C.

A native of Tyrol. At St. Clement's Nov. 1, 1852, to June 17, 1866; attended St. Agatha July 6, 1856, to Aug. 15, 1857; at Macton, Huron and Woolwich. St. Clement's Church was under the Interdict from June, 1865, to June 17, 1866. He left St. Clement's to return to Europe, but only got to Rochester where he had to go to hospital, in which he died Jan. 11, 1867. He was buried through charity by local people. (Page 80.)

MEYER, CHARLES, Rev., C.R.

Born May 27, 1887, at St. Clement's, Ont. At St. Jerome's College, Berlin, 1901 to 1906; at Chicago Novitiate 1906 to 1908; at Rome 1908 to 1914; ordained at Rome July 25, 1913; at St. Jerome's College since Sept., 1914.

MEYER, PAUL J., Rev.

Born at St. Clement's, Ont., March 4, 1887; at St. Jerome's College, Berlin, 1901 to 1907; at the Grand Seminary, Montreal, 1907; ordained at Hamilton July 25, 1910; first Mass at St. Ann's, Hamilton, July 26, 1910; assistant at Walkerton, July 26, 1910, assistant at St. Mary's, Brantford, 2 months; assistant at St. Basil's, Brantford, 9 months; assistant in New Germany, 3 months; Administrator at Chepstow, 14 months; in the West for about 1 year, 1913; pastor of Hespeler since 1914; the Hespeler Church was burned March 18, 1916. (Pages 92, 156, 157, 158.)

MILLS, ROBERT R., D.D.

Born at Dublin in 1798, a convert from Anglicanism Dec. 6, 1818. Studied in Ireland and St. Sulpice, Paris. Left Dublin in 1836. At Boston, Providence; at Kingston 1838; sent to London and St. Thomas 1838 to 1840; pastor of Dundas 1840 to 1842; of Brantford 1842, to Feb. 12, 1843; at St. Thomas and London 1843 to 1846; at Adjala 1847 to 1849. Then he became a Trappist at Gethsemane, Ky., where he died. He was a great preacher in demand at corner stone layings and church dedications, but had one failing, for which his faculties were finally withdrawn.

MONAGHAN, MICHAEL.

At Hamilton July 23, 1850; at Ingersoll 1850 (De Charbonnel).

MONTAG, ALPHONSE, Rev.

Born at Carlsruhe, Ont., Dec. 12, 1876. At St. Jerome's College, Jan., 1896, to June, 1901; at the Grand Seminary, Montreal, 1901; ordained at Berlin Dec. 17, 1904, the first ordination in the new church; assistant at New Germany Dec., 1904, to April, 1908; at Walkerton 1908 to July, 1909; pastor of Deemerton since.

MOTZ, JOHN, MR.

(Page 134.)

MOSER, JOHN, MR.

MUNCOG, FATHER M.

Born in France, 1829. Was pastor of Baby Point below Pt. Lambton, on missionary tour across the country to Owen Sound, where he bought a horse at a place near the town. Was drowned or murdered on a night sick call across the Detroit River to Algonac in the night following, Jan. 1, 1856. He was only 27 years old. He is still held in veneration at Port Lambton, to where his remains were transferred when the church was built there.

MUOBIS, JOS., Rev.

A native of Holland. Ordained in Roermond in 1868; at Formosa, pastor, Dec., 1872, to 1874; occasionally at Hamilton 1874 to 1876; at New Germany to Jan. 1, 1881, about 5 months; chaplain of a nunnery at Tegelen, Holland, since, for many. Retired, about 72 years old (1916).

MURPHY, GEO. PATRICK.

Ordained July 2, 1893; at Cathedral April 30, 1894; Freelon July, 1897 to July, 1901; Dundalk, 1910; Cayuga, May 1, 1914.

NADEAU, PAUL, S.J.

Born Aug. 10, 1833; entered Oct. 16, 1862; Indian missionary occasionally at Guelph. Died at Sault-au-Recollet, May 6, 1897, aged 64 years.

NEWMAN.

At Indiana and Cayuga, etc., about 1858.

NIEMANN, CLEMENT, Rev.

He came from Germany, an Ex-C.S.S. R. To Rome in 1872; from there he went to Berlin, Ont., and was appointed to New Germany in 1873, where he remained till 1888, when he went to Kansas. A number of years later he was in Buffalo, built a fine church there in the later 90's, of which he was pastor for some years. Then he retired and lived some years near that church till his death about 1911. (Page 67.)

NOLIN, J. B., S.J.

Born July 12, 1849. Entered July 30, 1870; ordained May 27, 1877; at Guelph Nov., 1877, to May, 1879; occasionally in 1883 and 1912. Died at Midland Nov. 16, 1914.

O'BIERNE, JOHN.

At Brantford, Ont., Nov. 25, 1849, to June 6, 1850.

O'CONNELL, D. B. J., Rev.

Born June, 1844. Ordained by Archbishop Lynch, June 29, 1874; at Hamilton July 26, 1874, to May, 1876; at Mt. Forest May, 1876, to Jan. 28, 1886; at Galt Feb., 1886, to 1889; at Walkerton, 1889, to Oct., 1892; at Mt. Forest Oct. 26, 1892, to Feb., 1908. Died at Mt. Forest, Feb. 2, 1908. Is buried under the church there.

O'CONNOR, J.J.

Ordained Dec. 18, 1909. Briefly at the Cathedral in 1910; at Brockville (1916).

O'DOUGHERTY, J., Rev.

In the Province about 1850 (De Charbonnel); at Brantford briefly Feb., 1852.

O'DWYER, PATRICK, Rev.

Born 1802, in the Archdiocese of Caskel, Tipperary Co. Ordained Oct. 13, 1833; came to Quebec; at St. Dunstan's, Beauport, Grosse Isle; in Upper Canada in 1837; at Adjala 1840 to Oct., 1841; at Dundas March 1, 1845, to Dec. 28, 1846; at London Feb. 7, 1847; at Brantford July, 1850, to June, 1852; in 1847 he visited Ireland, but returned.

O'FLYNN, JAMES, Rev.

Born at Ballinough, County Roscommon, Ireland, Feb. 1, 1796. Ordained May 26, 1820; to Kingston in 1837; at St. Thomas and London, 1838, 1842, 1850; at Dundas and Oakville, etc., May, 1842, to June, 1843; at Adjala, June 4, 1843, to March 9, -846, when he left the Province.

O'GARA, E. T., S.J.

Born Dec. 28, 1871, at Ottawa(?). Entered Aug. 14, 1890; ordained Aug. 6, 1905; at Guelph, 1907, again in 1910; at St. Joseph's College, St. Boniface, 1913; at St. Ignatius' Church, Winnipeg, Man., 1916.

O'HANDLEY, A. M.

A Nova Scotian. Ordained Nov. 1, 195; at the Cathedral, Hamilton, Oct. 11, 1903, to Dec. 4, 1904.

O'LEARY, JOHN S., Rev.

Born in Adjala. At St. Francis Xavier College, N.Y.; St. Mary's College, Montreal; ordained July 7, 1877; at Hamilton July, 1877, to 1880; at Oakville from Hamilton; at Macton July, 1894, to March, 1895; at Freilton July, 1882, to July 29, 1894; at Cayuga, assistant. (Pages 171 and 172.)

O'LOANE, JAMES, Rev., S.J.

Born at Centreville, near Berlin. Baptized at Preston; joined the S.J. in Montreal; ordained at Montreal, June 29, 1888; at Guelph Jan. 8, 1890; pastor of Guelph. Died in Guelph, April 29, 1913.

O'REILLY, EUGENE, Rev.

Born in the Parish of Drumlomine, Diocese of Ardagh, County Cavan, in 1800. To Canada in 1832; studied at Chamblay; ordained June 19, 1836; near Toronto on the 5th line, attended various immissions from there, also Oakville, 1837; at the Toronto Gore, 1847 to 1859; resigned in 1860. Died at Dundas while on a visit to his nephew, Rev. Dean O'Reilly, in Oct., 1861.

O'REILLY, FRANK, Rev.

Ordained in Hamilton with Father E. P. Slaven, Sept. 1, 1878; at Arthur, assistant, Dec. 15, 1878; assistant in Paris; attends Galt; at Macton, pastor, March, 1882, to June, 1890; at Caledonia, June, 1890, to June, 1894; at St. Patrick's, Hamilton, assistant, April, 1894, to March, 1899; at Oakville, pastor, June 21, 1900, to 1905. Died at Oakville, April 27, 1908. Buried at Oakville.

O'REILLY, JOHN, Very Rev., Dean.

Born March, 1818, in Cavan County, Ireland. To Canada in 1842. Studied at Chamblay and the Grand Seminary, Montreal; ordained July 5, 1846; at Dundas 1846 to 1847; assistant at Hamilton 1847; at Brantford, pastor, 1852 to 1859. In 1847 he was called to Toronto to assist in the epidemic there. At Dundas 1847 to 1867; also attended Oakville from Dundas as well as Waterdown and from Brantford he attended Paris and Galt, etc. He built the grand church at Dundas and the Separate School. Died at Dundas Nov. 14, 1887, aged 67 years.

O'REILLY, TERENCE, Rev.

Born in Kileria, Cavan Co., Ireland, 1815. At Hamilton Aug. 16, 1846, to Nov. 14, 1846; at Walkerton Sept. 24, 1878; Oakville Oct., 1878, to March, 1884. Died at Dundas March 26, 1884; is buried under the Oakville church.

O'SHEA, MICHAEL MARY, Rev.

Father Arnold was with him during his illness for 6 months. Died at Dundas Aug. 13, 1907. Was buried at Ayton Aug. 16, 1907.

PARKER ALPHONSE.

Ordained July 15, 1883; at the Cathedral April 1, 1911, to Aug. 6, 1911; at Elora and Fergus, Sept., 1911, to Feb., 1912; left for the United States.

POINT, NICHOLAUS, S.J.

An Indian missionary. Passingly at Guelph in 1854. Died at Quebec July 3, 1868.

POINT, PETER, S.J.

Ordained June 5, 1826. At Sandwich 1843 to 1859; founded the college 1857; finished the church 1846; at Penetang; at Montreal, 1888. Died at Montreal Sept. 19, 1892.

Died at Sandwich, Ont., July 16, 1781.

POWELL, JOHN A.

At the Hamilton Cathedral briefly in 1910; Flinton, Ky., 1916.

POWER, MICHAEL, Right Rev.

Born at Halifax, N.S., Oct. 17, 1904. At Montreal and Quebec Seminary; ordained by Bishop Dubois of New York, Aug. 27, 127; at Drummondville 127 to 1831; at Ottawa Missions up to Bytown, 1831 to 1833; pastor of St. Martin 1833 to 1839; pastor of Lemaire and V.-G. until appointed Bishop, 1839 to 1842; consecrated May 8, 1842, Bishop of Toronto. Louis Funcken; came with him to Canada in 1864; at New Germany; at Karlsruhe May, 1866, to Dec., 1887; here he built the fine church and the stone rectory. He died Dec. 23, 1887. While in Karlsruhe he had a fierce attack of typhoid fever that disabled him for several years. He never recovered his former vigor and agility.
