4862 William Hastings Line	Hastings/Bellmont House	1861	<p data-bbox="800 305 1083 334"><u>Cultural Heritage Value</u></p> <p data-bbox="800 342 1824 440">This house was built in 1861 by William Hastings who had acted as a Justice of the Peace in the Crosshill area. The house is well maintained in its original state. It is said that skilled craftsmen were specifically hired to complete the stonework of the house.</p> <p data-bbox="800 483 1791 581">The house resembles an example of a Gothic style stone structure.
