1215 Queen's Bush Road	Queen's Hotel	1855	<p data-bbox="772 332 1054 362"><u>Cultural Heritage Value</u></p> <p data-bbox="772 391 1852 537">The Queen's Hotel was built in 1855 by Hugh Freeborn and was originally known as "Black Horse Inn. From 1857 to 1881 it was owned by William Doersam who operated it as an inn and blacksmith shop. The hotel's current name was established in 1894, possibly to commemorate Queen Victoria's Jubilee.</p> <p data-bbox="772 566 1839 673">It is a typical example of a building in Georgian style. The structure was constructed using local mixed field stone having three over three symmetrical bays.
