ent/Burrell House is named after the original holder of the Crown patent, orge Ament Jr. who purchased the property in 1858. He assisted in laying settlement of Heidelberg. The property was purchased in 1878 by Johann (John) Hahn. The Hahn family owned the house for approximately 100 years.

The house is listed in the 1861 census as a 1 1/2 story brick building. Because the current structure is 2 storeys, it must have been built after the 1861 census. The main house is a typical example of Georgian influenced architecture. The smoke house is a particularly excellent example of this type of structure and dates the same period as the main house.

The front façade has 3-over-3 symmetrical bays. The upper door was once a window, altered when the upper porch was added around the turn of the 20th century. As is common in the Georgian style, the porch wall was plastered, now covered by insulbrick. The house and summer kitchen are constructed of triple brick. There was once a bake oven, but it has been filled in.

## **Designated Features**

- Front or south facade including the red brick with plastered front under the porch, the bays, windows, and porch posts
- Side or east façade including the triple red brick, bays, attic bays, round iron tie rod ends, and cellar entrance
- Tail Section including the round log rafter construction and pegged construction
- Soffits, facia, and return eaves
- Smoke house including its triple brick construction style
