Designated Features

- Front or south façade including the porch, bell tower, doorway, fanlight, sidelights, datestone and segmentally arched, double-hung windows and casement windows
- Hip roof and roofline including fascia, soffit, and frieze boards
- Portions of the interior of the building including the entrance vestibule, the majestic central staircase, the tongue and groove wainscotting with original brass coat-hooks and matching tongue and groove ceilings in the lower and upper hallway
