

Designed with a Neo-Classical Revival style, the structure was built with local fieldstone exterior and cut limestone quoins. The structure has plenty of unique elements including an octagonal spire and finial. The church has a large wood door that maintain original locks that are opened by an eight-inch iron key. The church has an engraved dedication stone which reads, "Duetsche ev. Luth./St. Johannes/Kirche/1872".

## **Designated Features**

1982.

- North, East, and West facades of the building
- Roof line of the building gable with soffits and narrow fascia with no return eaves
- Bell tower, louvered with tin, octagonal "Swiss/Bavarian" spire and finial
- Neo-Classical style, coursed field stone with cut limestone quoins
- Windows with six over six panes and mock fanlight (four wedge shaped panes forming semi-circular upper sections)
- Arched front door
- Keystone of cut limestone
- Engraved dedication stone as "Duetsche ev. Luth./St. Johannes/Kirche/1872"
