Descendants of William Cunningham

Generation No. 1

1. William¹ Cunningham¹ was born June 17, 1800 in Ireland, and died October 04, 1881. He married **Altha Eliza Lewis** April 19, 1829 in West Gwillimbury, Ontario, daughter of Benjamin Lewis and Sarah Baker. She was born July 09, 1809 in USA, and died December 10, 1883.

Notes for William Cunningham:

First appears on Lot 2 Con 6 (N1/2) in Bond Head West Gwillimbury. It is my belief that William married Altha Eliza Lewis daughter of Benjamin Lewis who lived at Lot 2 Con 7. William Cunningham owned con 6 lot 2 north half 1834-1839.

According to Phyllis Eagan the below was found in the Terry family being the wedding vows of William and Altha. I have an original copy of the banns that were read 3 times before their marriage. I went and visited with Margaret Terry's daughter Joan in July 2006. Who had the banns. She also gave me a lot of pictures of the children of David and Mary Ann (Cunningham) Terry family. She also had in her possession a sofa that is in her basement that belonged to William and Altha. Joan gave me 2 Lustre Ware tea cups and saucers that were also William and Altha's. She also gave me a rolling pin that belonged to Mary Ann Cunningham, Joan has two other rolling pins one was her mother's Margaret Terry and the other belong to Eliza Terry (McIntyre).

"Whereas William Cunningham and Eliza Lewis both of the township of West Gwillimbury are desirous of marrying with each other and there being no parson or minister of the Church of England being within eighteen miles of them or either of them, they applied to me for that purpose.....That in pursuance of an act drafted in the thirty third year of his late Majesty's reign for such power granted, I, George Ramsey, JP, having carried the previous notice by the said act required to be issued have this day married the said William Cunningham and Eliza Lewis together and they are become legally contracted to each other. Dated this 19th day of April 1829, George G. Ramsey JP, signed by Eliza Lewis and William Cunningham"

1851 census William born Ireland Christian and being 52 years of age in Wellesley Township. 1871 and 1881 census indicates that William Cunningham lived in Wellesley Township being born in Ireland and was head of the household in census. Also indicating religion of being Methodist

In the late 1700s and early 1800s, when immigrants came from the British Isles and USA to settle in Upper Canada, they had physical strength and good health, or they had nothing at all. These people moved around a lot, even though there were no roads to speak of.

One of the main reasons for moving was to gain personal wealth by purchasing a wild lot of dense bush for \$2.50 an acre, clear some of the property for agriculture, and build a log house and barn, then sell it at a profit and move on to another wild lot in a back township and start all over again. They may do this every two years; the more times, the more profit. Most settlers started close to Yonge Street built about

1797/8, then moved out from there. Population was very small. Most people would know their Neighbours for miles around.

Look in land grants/lot ownership and maps in the southeast corner of Tecumseh Township around 1843. The Cunninghams may have been there prior to 1843 when I understand William Cunningham moved to Wellesley Township. Some of the Hawks resided in that corner of Tecumseh prior to moving to Wellesley in 1846. If that's the case, then they would have known each other from there, or earlier closer to Yonge Street, or they may have been drawn together by the common cause of Rebellion against the Family Compact.

Records indicate from a book "Maple Leaf Journal" on 1861 Tremaine map, listed as Justice of the Peace, owner of a farm Lot 7, Concession 11 west of Hawkesville in Wellesley Township being know as the community of Beech Vale. In 1850 William Cunningham was on the Wellesley council. The Cunningham lived across the street from the Ballard Family. Street is now known as Ament Line. #4352

I recently found a copy of the original land deed for the above property dated July 3, 1847. THANK YOU to the Burkhardt family who currently live in the Cunningham homestead still had the deed.

History of Hawkesville by Grace Orgram (part of)

In 1837 a young Scot named William Lyon MacKenzie led a revolt against the "Family Compact", but was defeated at York (now Toronto) and fled to the United States. Two of his Lieutenants were captured and hanged for treason. One was Samuel Lount, brother of Benjamin Hawke's wife Mary. Samuel Lount's mother maiden name was Hughes. The Hawks, Hughes and Lounts were Quakers, so after the execution a group decided to leave Simcoe County. The Hawkes, Hughes, Deans, Winns, Bakers, Honsingers, Cunninghams, Andersons, Wrights and Petches moved to Wellesley Township.

A cemetery was started on the present site with the oldest stone according to the 1985 reading being in Row 11 #32

James, son of William and Eliza Cunningham died Oct 18, 1849 aged 18 years.

In the early 1850's a small gore lot was located along the section line, about one mile east of Linwood, one of several similar gores of land created by the early surveyors. And it was here that the first pioneers began trickling settlement of this wooded countryside. The Methodist settlers built the first log church on this gore station, with a log parsonage, its first resident pastor being Reverend Mr Ryder. Mr and Mrs Ryder were still residing here by the time of the construction of the new church in 1862. Originally, Hall's Circuit extended north and south from Macton to Beechvale School and east to west from Redhill to Linwood. Some of the earliest names recorded in hall's Church were: the Coulters, Mr and Mrs William Crooks, the Harrows, the Rennies, the Ballards, the Hawkins family, the Kennedys, Hariet petch and the Cunninghams.

Hawkesville history given by Ron Hackett..

John Hawk, founder of Hawkesville, was son of Benjamin Hawk and Mary Lount. Benj died May 14, 1865 in Hawkesville, Canada West. John's mother, Mary Lount, died March 9, 1876 in Hawkesville, Ontario. John Hawk was born in 1808 in Catawissa, Pennsylvania. He married Martha Dean in 1832. She was the daughter of George Dean and Elizabeth Hoshel, born August 7, 1810, in Allegheny County, Pennsylvania.

John & Martha Hawk's son, Samuel Lount Hawk, born 1836 in Tecumseh Township, married Jane Cunningham, March 18, 1862 in Hawkesville. (not related to my Cunningham's)

William Hawk, John's brother, had the next farm west to William Cunningham, Concession 11, Lot 8, and John's brother Pierce (or Piercifer) had the next farm west again on part Lot 9.

Jane must have been a granddaughter of William Cunningham??? whose family farm was next to two Hawk farms on the same road. (Have not figured out if there is a connection to this Jane Cunningham) Martha Dean, John's wife, was related somehow to W. H. Dean and where Irene fits in, I dunno. A John

Wright had a farm on Concession 14, part Lot 7, just north of the Ballard lands. Walter Dean & John Dean had farms northwest of Hawkesville, Conc. 15, part Lot 4.

Robinson Bulmer had the farm across the road from Wallenstein on Line 86.

Interesting how boy meets girl and how family lines meet and cross. All I can say, the early settlers around here were sure prolific before they moved on to greener pastures, but then the Mennonites took their place and you ain't seen nothing until you see how prolific they are still.

1. William Cunningham purchased a parcel of land on the corner of Alfred St. and Manser Road, Linwood (Lot 10 Concession 10) in 1874 and owned that piece until 1878.

2. William Cunningham purchased Lot 11 Wright's Survey (today 5148 Ament Line, Linwood) in 1876 and kept that lot until 1883.

3. William Cunningham purchased lots 19 and 20 of Wright's Survey (today 5112 Ament Line, Linwood) in 1878 and then sold them in 1882 to William Ballard. (Note in 1885 the Methodists purchased the site and built their church and parsonage on lots 19 and 20 Wrights survey)

About 1839 William & Eliza moved to Wellesley where William became Justice of the Peace (Jean Hamilton)

When they got to Wellesley, William built a story and a half log cabin which was their home for 12 years or so when they replaced it with a stone house. They lived near the village of Hawkesville. She went back to West Gwillimbury to visit her parents every now and then, possibly by train. They seem to have had a happy home with lots of singing and dancing whenever an excuse arose. William was a farmer and a justice of the peace for the area of Wellesley.

Notes from Carole Chapman....

Grandma Elizabeth Lewis, or as she liked to be called, Eliza, was born in the United States on Sunday, 9 July 1809. Sometime after that she moved with her parents to West Gwillimbury, Simcoe County, Canada, where they lived near the present day village of Bond Head.

She got married, by License, to the boy next door, who was William Cunningham. They were married by Mr. George Ramsay, likely a justice of the peace for the area then, on Sunday, 19 April 1829. They lived in West Gwillimbury, next door to her parents until 1839, when they and many others in the area packed their things up, sold out and moved to Wellesley Township in Waterloo County, about 100 miles away. Most of her brothers and their families, joined the exodus.

Wellesley was just being surveyed at that time and land wasn't up for grabs, but some got in there early and squatted on the land until it was available, then quickly bought it. They had 5 children at that time and another one on the way.

Montezuma was the executor of his father's estate. It took him thirty years to complete Thomas' wishes. There were many trips between Brotherston and Newmarket, sometimes through heavy snow in winter, having to travel via train from Palmerston to Stratford, to Berlin (Kitchener), and on to Newmarket.

Montezuma travelled to Philadelphia April 5, 1880 to see his dying brother, Albert.

Canadian County Atlas Digital Project indicates Montezuma owned Lot 34, Concession VII, Whitchurch Township, York County in 1878.

May 1, 1879 Menno Shoemaker had his hand badly cut by a saw. His father-in-law took him to Palmerston to the doctor to be sewn up. Menno died as a result of an accident in a grist mill he and his two sons, Addison & Leslie, were running in Newbridge. Machine was running too fast and it flew apart, catching Menno in the leg (January 1916). Died from blood clot & blood poisoning.

Menno and his brother Albert were twins.

Abram was the fourth child of Thomas Smith who in 1834 in the County of Armagh Ireland had married 17 year old Margaret Bullard. The Bullard men were soliders, some of whom had fought under the Duke of Wellington, at the Battle of Waterloo. To get away from the terrible conditions in ireland, caused by political and relious strife. Thomas and his young wide deecided to emigrate to Canada. And so in 1837 with their two young children and accompanied by other members of the Bullard family as well as some friends and neighbors, they made the three month voyage by sailing vessel.

Abraham was one of eleven children, was the second child born to Margaret and Thomas in Canada. Thomas died when Abram was 15 years old and Margaret was left to raise her large family alone in the bush in the North Easthope Township Perth County, Upper Canada. Margaret was a remarkale women and she managed to somehow to raise and educate her family. Abram became a school teacher. His Teachers Certificate from Upper Canada College is signed by no less a personage than Egerton Ryerson. In one of schools he had a pupil a pretty irish colleen by the name Eliza Cunningham. When Eliza was 17 the teacher and his pupil were married. The Cunningham's were naval people, some whom fought under Haratio Nelson. Like the Smiths and Bullards they had made their way to Canada, from

strife torn Ireland, to carve for themselves homesteads in the wilds of Upper Canada, now the province of Ontario.

Mr. and Mrs. A.B. Smith celebrated their diamond wedding day [Jan 12 1925] here [Neepawa, Manitoba] Monday last at the home of their son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Fred. McClain with whom they reside.

Mr. Smith is of Irish descent his parents having settled nearly a century ago, in the virgin forest of Ontario, near where Stratford now stands. He was born on the 17th Jan. 1843 and taught school in Ontario for forty years, amongst his pupils being Ben. And Jos. Jackson of this district and Major Robertson and Jas. McLaren of Basswood. Mr. Smith has taught three generations of his own family - his wife, his children and grandchildren. On the 12th Jan 1865 at the Manse at Cross Hill, Ont., he was married by the Rev. Jas. Boyd to Eliza, daughter of the late Wm. Cunningham [later] of Hawkesville, a real old timer also from Ireland and whose land was the first dated [registered] land in that province. In recalling their lonely childhood this couple recall laying awake at night afraid of the howling of the timber wolves around them - on one occasion the remains of a deer pulled down in the night being found the following morning close to the Smith's cabin. Mr. and Mrs. Smith moved west to Medicine Hat in 1904 where he taught school for 11 years at Walsh and Waterglen, both in Alta, moving to Neepawa in 1915 where they have resided since. They are both mentally and physically fairly fit. Mrs. Smith being four years junior to her husband is perhaps a little more active. Mr. Smith has enjoyed a long retirement, but he "carried the saddle" till he was 71 years of age.

This venerable couple, coming from families of twelve and ten respectively, have two sons. Dr. Alison Smith of Medicine Hat and W. Cunningham Smith M.L.A. for Redcliffe, Alta., and three daughters, Mrs. H. Altman of Wellesley, Ont; Mrs. T.L. Lokier, River Bend Ranch Medicine Hat and Mrs. Fred McClain of Neepawa; also there are nine grandchildren.

The happy couple spent a most enjoyable day, being the recipients of many congratulations and tokens of esteem, the best of which was a bunch of sixty magnificent carnations in excellent condition all the way from Dr. and Mrs. Smith in Medicine Hat, Alta and being one for each year of the happy union.

He was a Farmer.(2) James arrived in York County (Newmarket?) from England and then moved to the Drayton area Concession 10 Lot 4 (Wellington County-Peel Township) where he met and married Margaret Cunningham. They then moved to the Wallace area (Concession 6, Lot 43,44 N1/2). James was unable to read or write (Census). See obituary in paper on Jan 24, 1902. Buried at Bretherston Cemetery. Get photocopy of articles (ie Church membership certificate from June 15, 1885) from Beulah Carlberg in Fergus.

In 1868, Montezuma Brothers donated land for the Church and Cemetary (Brotherston Church). In 1884, Montezuma Brothers started a general store and a post office. The store and post office were situated where Robert Hood's (James A. Hood's son) barn stands today.

James Hood purchased Lot 45/46N Con. 5 in 1899 and sold them to his son Charles in 1901. (The History of Wallace Township book P. 522). James Hood bought Lot 43/44 N1/2 in 1884 and sold it to James A. Hood in 1901 (The History of Wallace Township book P. 527)

Bretherston Mennonite Church was formed after about 10 Mennonite families arrived from Waterloo County around 1864-1869. In 1871 a meeting house was built on Con. 6. Isaac Webber became the first pastor in 1869. During the 1870's the church was evenly split between the old order and the Mennonite Brethern in Christ. They alternated use of the meeting room but eventually the old order moved elsewhere. In 1879 the church became known as the "New Mennonite" order. In 1901 the church was rebuilt using the old foundation.

James may have met Margaret in Wallace since her sister was married to Montezuma Brothers and a William Cunningham owned the Hood property from 1864 to 1870 while Montezuma Brothers owned it from 1854 to 1864 and 1870 to 1884. This is when James bought it, although James children were born in Wallace township before 1884. One child, Lillian, was born in 1876. James was married in 1872?

A W.O. Shoemaker (Pastor) wrote an article on the history of the Wallace United Missionary church (Brotherston Mennonite church).

He was given \$200 in his father's will.

A Cunningham owned the Hood property before the Hoods. But the Cunninghams defaulted on their mortgage. Charles Hood currently owns the property around the Brotherston cemetary (formerly Montezuma Brothers' property & Post Office). (Charles Hood - 1996)

Allen Hood currently owns the Hood house and Orchards (Circa late 1800's). The house was originally designed with a large kitchen with the intention of adding on an addition later. This never happened. (Charles Hood - 1996) He was married to Grace Hargrave on Feb 12 1890 in Minto Twp, ON. (18)

Dr Allison Smith Loved Golden West

Funeral services were held on Tuesday afternoon Feb 26, 1957, for Dr Allison Smith, a pioneer of the Western Canada, which he loved so dearly for more than half a century.

The wide expanse of the prairies held great appeal for him and Dr Smith often expresses gratification at having made his home in the west and especially Medicine Hat. All his interests over the years were centered in this district including outdoors and sports, interests ranching and the practice of his profession dentistry.

Born in Linwood Ontario in 1869 Dr Smith was the eldest son of the late Mr and Mrs A. B. Smith. He obtained his primary and secondary schooling in Ontario but took his university degree studies in the United States. He attended the University of Colorado, where he was a demonstrator for a time and then the University of Chicago where he graduated in 1898.

Then returning to Canada, Dr Smith established his first practice in Winnipeg. In 1901 he married Margaret Gertrude Maveety, of Prince Albert Sask, who's father was one of the pioneer newspaper publishers of the west. Later, Dr Smith decided to go into ranching business and came to Medicine hat for that purpose. He continued ranching until 1922 when he resumed his practice of his profession in Medicine hat, retiring in 1948.

Dr Smith was keenly interested in Sports : was a member of St Barnabas Anglican Church and Masonic order, having joined the fraternal order i Killarney Manitoba in 1904.

He is survived by his wife Gertrude: one son Cecil of Chapleau Ontario; and four daughters Mrs JR Davison of Pickering, Ont; Mrs LB McNaughton (Gertrude) of Long Beach Calif; Mrs SB Phibbs (Patricia) of Toronto: and Mrs Lorraine A Gargett at home 534 Elventh St S.E.

Last rites for Dr Smith were conducted in St Barnabas Church the Ven Archdeacon JW Carter officiating. the hymns selected were Abide With me and Sun of My Soul Thou Saviour Dear.

Interment was in the family plot in the Church of England section of Hillside Cemetery. At the grave site JL Carswell, past master of Mizpah Lodge No 35 AF and AM conducted the Masonic Rites. Pallbearers were Messrs George Esmonde White, Gerald S Grant, T Gargett, R Papoe, WE McCombs and HWD Cox Cooks chapel was in charge.

Notes for Thomas Iliott Lokier:

Thomas Iliott Lokier was born in Shropshire, England, in 1868. He arrived in Canada in 1880, and began work immediately, at the age of 12, on various farms around Winnipeg. Later, he also worked on the C.P.R. He began to accumulate his own cattle herd and by 1900, he had over 100 head. As Thomas realized the need for more grazing land for his herd, he headed west in 1901, and entered into a partnership with J.B. Murphy of Medicine Hat on a 26,000 acre tract of land along the South Saskatchewan River. Soon, they had 1,000 head of cattle on their land. In 1903, Thomas married Eliza (nee Smith), who had been born in 1876 in Ontario, and had arrived in Medicine Hat in 1902. They had 2 children; Altha, born September 2, 1905, and William, born April 5, 1908. The family resided on the Bull Spring's Ranch until 1911. Mr. Lokier was known as a resourceful rancher; in dry years when natural grass was hard to come by, alfalfa was grown for forage. He also used natural gas from a drilled well on their own land to operate a pump to irrigate the fields where the alfalfa grew. In 1911, Thomas Lokier's partner died, and the ranch holdings were divided to settle the estate. Tom's half contained the big bend of the river and the ranch was therefore renamed River Bend Ranch. The Lokier's planted over 1,100 shrubs and trees into a shelter belt for their home. Thomas Lokier's ranching career ended unexpectedly however, in 1941, when his land was expropriated into the British Block at the Suffield Military Reserve. He and a few fellow ranchers then went to the West Coast to build ships for the war. During his retirement, he turned a triangle of vacant land near his home in Oak Bay, into a rose garden. On his 85th birthday, it was officially named Lokier Garden. He passed away in 1970, in Victoria, B.C., in his 102nd year.
