### EDITORIAL NOTES.

Editor Eby, of the Hesper Her-ald, who was one of the three baby judges in Berlin last week, announces joyfully in big glad-face types, that he is still alive. Congratulations, Brer Eby; but what about the other two fellows?

The Czar of Russia has given re-sponsible government to his people at last. This means that Russia will have parliamentary representation, free speech, trial by jury, and about all that is embodied in habes corpus. This marks the dawning of a better day for Russia, although the people have been for so long oppressed and uneducated that they will not be able at once to reap the highest benefits of this great change; but with the introduction of schools and the development of a national spirit, the rising generation in that country should be able, in time, to place Russia among the Christian nations who can, when a crisis comes, be depended upon by the world for good. Whatever the motive which prompted the Czar he has issued a decree which will make his name live forever in history, and will raise his people from a condition horrible to contemplate to a position which will make their prosperity depend upon themselves.

These are doleful times for newspaper writers. The dearth of news is noticeable in the painful grind of the editorials, the abundance of "boiler plate" all over the paper, and the struggle to make "first page stuff" with double column headings, out of any old item that can be picked up. Oh, for another war!

And still the Stratford Herald holds back from an agonized public the information as to what a "heavy haul" is. How cruel!

The C. P. R. now has a party of surveyors running a line from the south directly through Embro to Stratford. If that railroad connects Stratford with their main line just south of Embro they may not become anxious to build the Stratford-Linwood branch for several years if ever. Wellesley section should re-organize to watch its own interests.
