EDITORIAL NOTES.

The season is now approaching when the weather is cold out doors and coaled indoors.

The end of this latest Cuban insurrection is now in sight. The United States has placed a temporary governor in charge until the natives can hold an election to replace the Palma government. To this the insurrectionists consented and they are now rapidly disarming. Cuba has not been self-governing long enough to become reconciled to crooked elections. Here in Canada we're cautioned by them so that if "corruption" were left out of our campaigns most of our orators would be lost for a subject, and our daily paper would be just about forced out of politics altogether.

A new revision of the Ontario statutes is soon to be issued. It will occupy three large volumes.

The construction of the Guelph-Goderich branch of the C. P. R., is being pushed with the greatest activity. The rails are laid some distance west of Moncton and the road will be fully completed and in operation early next spring. As yet no regular passenger service has been given west of Elmira.
