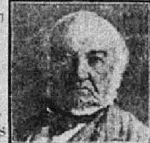

By-Law No. 1
A By-Law for Borrowing on the
credit of the Municipality of the
Township of Wellesley the sum
of \$1355.15 the proportion to be
contributed by said Municipality
for drainage work initiated by
the Municipality of the Township
of Mornington.
Previously adopted the Fourth day
February, A. D. 1907.
WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality
of the Township of Mornington hereinafter
called "the Initiating Municipality"
upon the Petition duly presented to said
Council for certain drainage work to be
done in the said Township of Mornington
has procured an examination to be made

by John Roger (th. L. R. being a person
competent for such purpose of the area
proposed to be drained, and the means
suggested for the drainage thereof and
of other lands and premises to be included
under the Municipal Drainage Act, and
has also procured plans, specifications and
estimates of the drainage work to be made
by the said John Roger, and an assessment
to be made by him of the lands and roads
to be benefited by such drainage work and
of other lands and roads liable for contribu-
tion thereto, stating as nearly as he can
the proportion of benefit to be derived
and incurring liability in consequence
of such drainage work by every road and
lot or portion of lot, the said assessment to
be made as regards the proportion to be con-
tributed by the Municipality of the Town-
ship of Wellesley for said drainage work
being the assessment hereinafter by this
By-law enacted to be assessed and levied
upon the funds and lots or parts of lots
hereinafter in that behalf specially set
forth and described:
AND WHEREAS a copy of the report,
plans, specifications, assessments and es-
timates of the said John Roger on the pro-
posed work have been duly served on the
Reeve of the Township of Wellesley;
AND WHEREAS the sum named in said
report as the proportion of the Township of
Wellesley of the cost of said drainage work
is \$1355.15 and it is necessary to raise the
said sum and pay over the same to the
Treasurer of the Initiating Municipality;
AND WHEREAS the Council of the Town-
ship of Wellesley are of the opinion that
the drainage of the said area is desirable.
THEREFORE the said Municipal Council
of the said Township of Wellesley pursuant
to the provisions of the Municipal Drainage
Act enacts as follows:
1. The said report, plans, specifications,
assessments and estimates are hereby
adopted.
2. For the purpose of raising the sum of
\$1355.15 the said Council do hereby order
that the Municipality of the Township of
Wellesley do hereby order that the funds
necessary for the work, fifteen per
cent of the said Township of Wellesley
