EDITORIAL NOTES.

The fire protection committee of the Wellesley Board of Trade were not in favor of going along with their work while the Baden railway scheme was pending for fear that two money bylaws might come upon the ratepayers at once. Now that the railway episode is closed there is nothing in the way and the committee should not delay any longer.

With the large roller mill closed and the railroad outlet scheme quashed Wellesley must hustle to hold its own these days. Such a fire disaster as has fallen upon Nendstadt and other unprotected villages recently would strike a blow at Wellesley's prosperity just now from which it would take years to recover. If, for the time being, our village is to suffer in a business sense, let it not be because of im providence and a lack of public spirited energy.

A Berlin newspaper hints that another six months will likely pass before the Conservative executive committees of the north and south ridings decide upon the person or persons to get the fat offices vacated by the death of the late Mr. McDougall. There is a legend to the effect that a party clique in the city once grasped so hard for one vote of office that they com pletely destroyed their party in the county. Is history already about to repeat itself?

What is there in political life which entitles those holding the highest offices to be placed in these fat life offices? The only two classes which get pensions are soldiers and politicians. The former gets his for wounds and injuries received in battle for his country; the latter possibly for damage to his character in party services. Really the electors, who are considered qualified to elect M. P. P's to appoint these office holders should be qualified to elect these officials themselves. It would certainly be a move towards purer politics, which is the country's greatest need to-day.

Wellesley township is grappling with the question of building bridges this year in earnest. These new bridges are all being made of a permanent nature so will be cheapest in the end. But it is a question if this permanent class of work should be paid for out of the current year's taxes. The rates are quite high now, and many, especially among the less wealthy classes, would favor raising a fund by debentures to pay for this class of work which will last through the lives of their children's children.

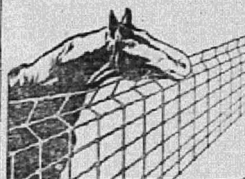
