That terrible railway disaster on the Caledon hills east of Orangeville last week shows the fearful, constant proximity travelling com-fort and disaster are in railroading. If a few railroad employ-ces are discharged or impaisoned, or a few hundred passengers killed or maimed, that is only an incident in the course of a great twentieth-century rush, and so is soon lest sight of.

This is the time of year when the city labor unions call off strikes and permit the workmen to get jobs at anything that will give them and their 'a nilies enough to subsist upon during the cold winter months. They have had the satisfaction of retarding building operations and business progress, and if they survive the hard winter they will likely do the same thing again next spring when they ought to be earning large wages. And all this because labor considers itself the legitimate enemy of capital and does n't know any other way of redoesn't know any otner way or re-turning eyil for evil. Surely there is brain enough in skilled labor organizations to evolve a better form of retaliation than the one that cuts off the bread from its own families.
